

Christmas Tree Lot Opens November 28 Over 1000 Volunteer Hours Needed



Ken Scharer, chairman of the club's newest fundraising project, the sale of Christmas trees, said that the club will start selling trees on Friday, November 28 in a lot at the corner of Matheson and Vine Streets. He emphasized that every member of the club will have to put in more than one shift in order to meet our goal of 1000 volunteer hours. The lot will be open Mondays through Fridays from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. and on Saturdays and Sundays from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.

The funds raised, and they could be considerable he indicated, will go to support the activities of the Healdsburg Boys and Girls Club, Boy Scout Troop 21, the Memorial Schlorship Fund, Healdsburg area athletic programs and the Animal Shelter.

Ken reported to the board that 624 trees at \$12,215 were ordered from Boise Cascade, 1,037 from Victorville at \$35,906.50. This

order is 400 less trees than ordered in 2002 when the Boys and Girls Club sponsored this project. The club has paid a fee of \$85 for a permit from the State Division of Forestry for spraying the trees. The club has three certified sprayers and only they can spray the trees. Also the club has rented a storage unit to store the spraying equipment and miscellaneous tools.

Members of the Christmas Tree Sales, assisting Ken Scharer, are Roger Dormire, Joe Engler, Hector Bedolla, Jim Lucchesi, Bob Taylor and LeRoy Steck. All members of the club are expected to participate in this project. Also helping will be members of the Key Club and Boy Scout Troop 21.

Matching Funds Still Available For The Kiwanis Memorial Scholarship Account

Through the generosity of two Kiwanis members who pledged \$1,000 in matching funds for the Memorial Scholarship Fund, almost \$600 is available. But time is running out even though the deadline has been lengthened.
