"Mitch" Mitchell brought us an interesting and pertinent program last week when he presented Russell Green, manager of the revitalized Simi Winery, just north of town. Mr. Green is basically optomistic about the future for grape growers in this area but pointed out that supply and demand still operates. Some other factors to consider are that the higher local prices are the more competive imports become, that existing tax shelter advantages which have brought great amounts of investor's capital into the business could be wiped out by simple federal action and that the borgeoning union strength will bring problems of greater costs and lesser grower control.

Today's program is of a completely different character. Harry Tappin is chairman and will present the High School A Capella Choir in a program of varied music. Bob Bush is the director of that group about which many nice things have been said.

Principal specification taken at the Board Directors meeting held last week at Relzy Aiken's house was the decision to charge Senior members and visitors \$1.75 for luncheons, up from a dollar fifty. Action on the new playground will await until equipment is ready to place. The rummage sale will probably not come until next fall when emphasis will be placed on items other than clothes. A great need now is to find a place to store big items which we hope we can collect. The International Relations Committee plans to establish at least an exchange of letters with some foreign club, but plans are still indefinite.
