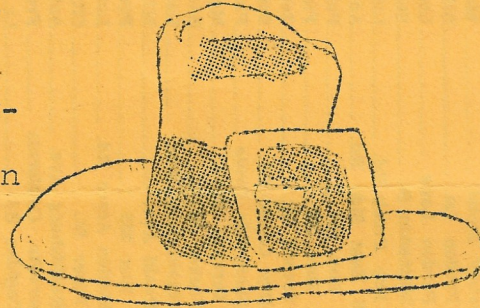

Boys and Girls Work One meeting - 3 members present. Committee had several projects under consideration. Report was made on the work accomplished at Camp Rosenberg.

Circle K and Key Clubs One meeting - 3 members present. The Key Club had an inter-club meeting with Kiwanis with some 30 Key Club members present and 55 members in attendance.
