3. Crime rate very low in Russia - probably due to severe penalties for crimes.
4. Science, engineering, medicine programs in colleges are very good - business administration - not so good.
5. Good transportation systems in large cities. Roads outside cities very poor. One in ten own a car.
6. Women given equal opportunity with men to do hard physical labor.
