Dear Kiwanian:

As you are no doubt aware, our General Fund Account has operated on a "defecit basis" for some years. The surplus of prior years has been exhausted and a loan of \$500.00 was made in 1966 to the General Fund from our Luncheon Fund. At the July 6, 1967 Board of Director's Meeting your Board took action to cover the defecit in the General Fund and to repay the \$500.00 loan. Your billing for the final quarters of 1967 will be changed as follows:

You will note that this new billing changes the distribution of Club revenues, but the total billing remains unchanged. The Board of Directors feels that since this Administration Fee represents funds required for the operation of our Club, all members should share in that cost. Therefore, the Board unanimously voted to include this Administration Fee in the billings for both Senior and Privileged Members for the third and fourth quarters of 1967.

They feel certain that you will approve their choice of action.
