Clarence Ruonavaara announced again that the American Field Service Annual Christmas Card drive is on for the next three weeks....Nancy Curnow announced that the Community Thanksgiving Service will be held at St. John's church on Wednesday evening at 7 p.m., cosponsored by the local churches. Canned good donations will be accepted for Shared Ministries and there will be light refreshments following the service....Wayne Carr announced the Community Chorus will perform their annual Christmas program on Sunday, December 13 at the Federated Church. Performances will be at 2 and 4 p.m. Advance tickets are \$5 general and \$3 for seniors and children - tickets at the door will cost a dollar more...Phil Rice announced the revival of a former Kiwanis tradition of visiting area convalescent homes prior to Christmas to sing carols and distribute simple wrapped gifts. The afternoon of Tuesday, December 22 has been set for this event.... On the occasion of the club's 75th anniversary, Bruno Rodella provided a history of the club, noting the Healdsburg club had sponsored many of the existing clubs in the north coast area, starting with the Santa Rosa club in 1925. He also reminisced about the Kiwanis bowling teams and great times they had, especially at tournaments, and the well-attended trip to the International Convention in Vienna Austria.....The Key Club was in attendance and club officers and members were introduced by the club president Jennifer Costa.

Happy/Sad Dollars

All members present were happy that the club was having its 75th anniversary and ponied up a dollar for the cause.

Today's speaker was Jorjan Powers of the Assistance Dog Institute. Founded over 25 years ago in Sonoma County by Bonnie Bergin, the Institute trains dogs for the mobility impaired, typically in wheel chairs. The current program uses high school students at the Los Guilucos facility as the trainers. These juvenile offenders are given a chance to make a contribution back to society, while developing self esteem and pride in training the dogs. As part of their school curriculum, they spend an hour each day grooming the dogs and participating in group and individual training exercises. The dogs spend one night a week with their trainers to help them bond, and on Fridays they take the dogs on outings to public places. The dogs are trained in some of the basic commands, but also to pick up dropped items, turn on light switches and pull a person in a wheel chair. Training is done from wheel chairs, so the dogs become accustomed to performing their tasks for, and at that level. Recipients are screened and matched with their dogs based on personalities and needs, and must attend a two week training camp to learn how to handle the dogs. The Institute uses golden retrievers, breeds the dogs themselves, and all dogs are spayed or neutered before being placed. There currently is a 3 to 5 year wait to receive a dog. Since there is such demand, Bonnie Bergin now devotes her time to training people to train the dogs, and is known internationally for her work
