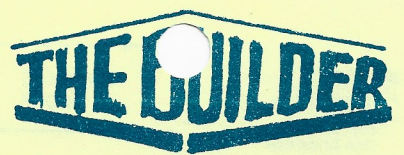

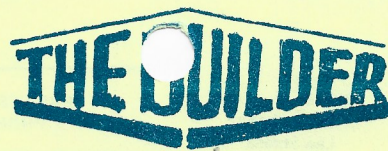
Bud Christensen will present a program featuring AFS Students Tuesday. Other than that we want to wish you all Happy New Year.

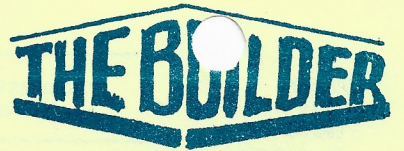

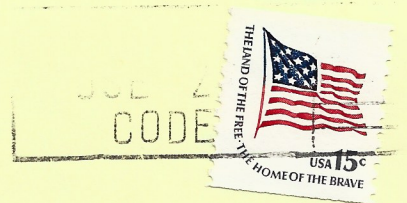
NEXT WEEKS PROGRAM
