

Christmas Tree Sales Very Successful: Many Volunteer Hours, Help from Organizations

Praising the members of the Christmas Trees Committee for their many hours of work planning the annual sale and the club members and their family members who vounteered their time, committee chairman Ken Scharer said that the annual Christmas Trees Sales project was a very successful one. He added that the club could not have operated the tree lot without the assistance of the Cloverdale Kiwanis Club, the men from the Salvation Army's Adult Rehabilitation Center at Lytton who were particularly helpful over the weekends, the Healdsburg High School Key Club and a number of individuals and Kiwanis Club family members.

Albert (Pete) Peterson, the club's treasurer, told *The Builder* at press time that the tree lot project grossed \$80,556 and netted approximately \$37,355. He termed the results "a little better than last year.

Ken said that he estimated that the club members and other volunteers put in over 1,080 hours during the 30 days the lot was open. He himself worked about 200 hours over that period of time. Each club member was asked to work 3 shifts ot 5 hours and many did more than that. Each of the 8 Christmas Tree Lot Committee members was assigned to be in charge of 4 days during the sales period and Joe Engleer took on the task of signing up the club members for the different shift periods. Tree Lot Committee members are Ken Scharer, chairman, Roger Dormire, Dennis Stead, Rick Norman, Jerry Strong, Joe Engler, Guy French and Don Marshall. Barry Smith served as the Tree Lot manager taking over the position for the first time this year.

The lot was open for 30 days closing on Monday night December 22 when only 15 trees were left out of the 1360 purchased from two distributors in Oregon. The remaining trees were placed outside the fence so local residents could be free to take one.

In addition to the trees – Noble Fir, Douglas, Grand Fir, Nordman, Silver tip and White fir which ranged in price from \$22 to \$350 – the Tree Lot sold garlands, wreaths and metal stands.



A reminder: the January 14 meeting of the the board of directors will be held at the newly refurbished Wendt Library at the Healdsburg High School. President Dennis Gary advised that representatives of the Healdsburg Education League are scheduled to attend the meeting and it seems appropriate to hold the meeting in the library "so that the board could get a hands-on look at the way in which its \$6500 computer seed money grant resulted in a total computer fundraising effort of \$147,000 for HEF and the library."

All Kiwanis club members are welcomed to attend board meetings which start at 7 p.m.

Kiwanis Participates with Seasonal Assistance to Three Organizations

At its November meeting the board of directors approved donations of \$1401, a part of helping local organizations during the Christmas season. At the request of board member Hunt Conrad the board approved a contribution of \$1001 to the Healdsburg Food Pantry, \$1 more than the Rotary Club!

At the suggestion of President Dennis Gary a donation of \$400 was awarded to the Healdsburg Senior Center for 20 food bags.

Again this year the Present Project program helped 78 families – 349 individuals – with new clothing

toys and gifts under the auspices of the Kiwanis Club. The Presents Project coordinators raise their funds and funnel it through the Kiwanis Club. Beth DeCoss of Project Presents said that the organization had 72 sponsors this year and greater community support. Presents Project works with the Healdsburg school district, 4-C's Day Care, Fitch Mountain Preschool and Alliance Medical Center. Its aim is to make certain that families and children not only receive needed items but also gifts from a personal wish list.

Third Graders Send Many Thanks

Dennis Stead, chairman of the club's First Book Project, the distribution of dictionaries to all third grade students in the Healdsburg school district, shared a number of thank you notes he received from the recipients of the program at the December 2 meeting/

Dennis explained that in presenting the dictionaries he tried to connect the children with the club by telling them how we raise the funds to buy the books – FFCF Food Booth, Pancake Breakfast, Christmas Tree Lot – and the response from the young audience is most gratifying.

Among the quotes – "Think you guys are very thoughtful", "Appreciate how you raise the money", "Happy I got this cool dictionary"...

The children are told that they can keep the dictionary at school or at home and often times it is the first book they have ever owned. Approximately 250 books were distributed late October and early November.
