The First Annual Christmas Tree Lot Award Presented to Beverly Dordahl

In appreciation for her many hours of service and hard work during December's Kiwanis Christmas Tree Sale the first annual Christmas Tree Lot award was presented to Beverly Dordahl by chairman Ken Dordahl and Committee member Dennis Stead January 27.

The club's venture in selling Christmas trees was monetarily very successful and required many volunteer hours from club members. But Bev did more than her share, spending almost every day at the lot being in charge of collecting the money and seeing that the fund balanced each day.

According to club secretary Dee Whitehall, club members devoted 1,250 volunteer hours to the Christmas Tree sale project, with 27 club members volunteering. Christmas Tree Sales committee members - Ken Scharer, chairman, Dennis Stead, Joe Engler, Roger Dormire, Chris Metrulas and Beverly Dordahl - devoted many, many hours to selling Christmas trees and making certain the project was a successful one. In addition the club received help from the Boy Scouts, Key Clubbers and members of the Cloverdale Kiwanis Club.

Since joining the club about three years ago, Beverly has been very active on various committees. She was elected to the board of directors for a two year term in 2003, is chair of the Inter-Club committee, co-chair of Young Chldren: Priority One committee, a member of the Fitch Mountain Foot Race Committee and serves on the First Book Project in which every third grade student receives a dictionary.


