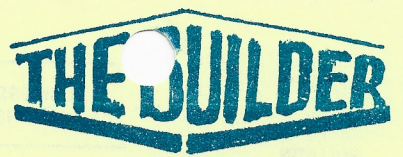

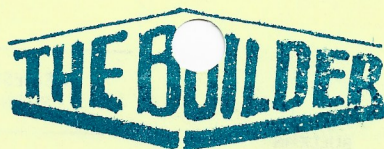
Topics of Interest:

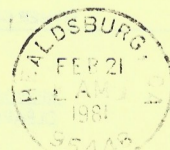
Scholarship Fund Started: President Ed announced that a "Kiwanis Scholarship Fund" has been started. More information will soon be given club members.
