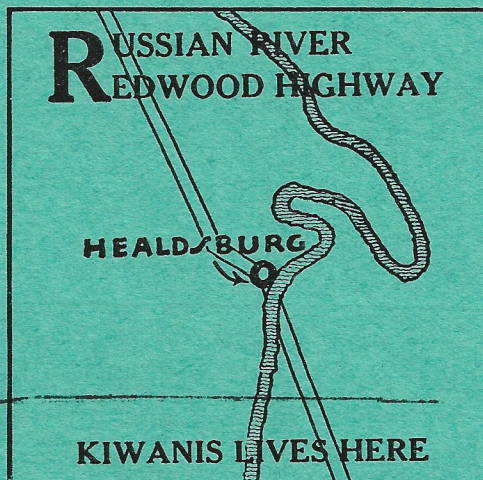
Leave it to "Bob" Cantu to picture the complexities, and yet understandable aspects in Civilian Defense set-up.
