This money has been accumulated over the last few years, mostly due to the lack of convention expenses. The question appears to be -- a deficiet this year against funds already accumulated or does the club want to be on a pay-as-you-go basis. A change in the Bylaws of this club must be done by a 2/3 majority of the members. Hence, on Feb. 27 you will be asked to vote yes or no on this proposed change.
