Thanks to By Gibbs for Col. Harpold and his unique presentation of Communism in the school and his association with the fellow travelers that he has known. It seems like Communism resembles Dry Creek. We try to do all we can to contain it, but every little while it breaks through and does damage to everything it touches and never does any good.

This week we are to have as our speaker Cerney J. Champion. Ken Gonzles will be chairman and reports that Mr. Champion, who is General Mgr. of the Redwood Empire Ass., will talk on the "Outlook for the REA".

As all will remember, the Editor was commissioned to "report" on the proposed dues increase. Armed with the Budget, Financial Report, Minutes and Telephone, an attempt will be made. Budget committee report (Al Huddart Ch.) \$2175.00 Expenses, Last year 2330.97 spent. Income Budget, \$1725.00 Last year income 1604.74 (deficiet \$726.97) Anticipated 1962 Deficiet \$450.00. The income from the increase of .50 cents in dues would offset this deficiet. However, the general fund has in it at the start of 1962 \$1524.06. This money has been accumulated over the last few years, mostly due to the lack of convention expenses. The question appears to be -- a deficiet this year against funds already accumulated or does the club want to be on a pay-as-you-go basis. A change in the Bylaws of this club must be done by a 2/3 majority of the members. Hence, on Feb. 27 you will be asked to vote yes or no on this proposed change.
