Last weeks program chairman, Dave Loop, presented Richard Thomas from the Santa Rosa Junior College Ag. Department. Mr. Thomas, a former Healdsburg High School Teacher, spoke about the future of the wine industry in Sonoma County. Some of the outstanding points made by Mr. Thomas were as follows:

1. He stated that the "Belden Memorial Center" will be completed at the Junior College by October 1st. The building will deal with wine related activities.
2. That it costs \$9000 to convert an acre of land to growing grapes.
3. The Junior College trains students to be working managers.
4. To date, there are 102 wineries in Sonoma County.
5. Mr. Thomas also stated that Coca Cola and Kraft Food is moving into the area which he claimed to be good for the wine industry. He stated that these companies have the ability to develop new wine consumers.
6. That the per cap consumption of wine is two gallons per person.

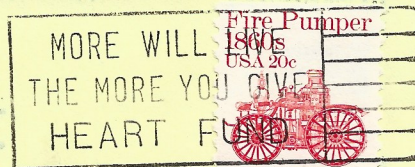
