During the month of February our efforts have again led us to attain a 99% ranking. Congratulations to all — THIS IS 3 MONTHS IN A ROW.



House follows and may serve to illustrate the point:

The house and lot at 437 First Street was purchased in April, 1969, by the Healdsburg Boy Scout Organization Committee, incorporated about 10 years ago, to receive and distribute funds from the Frank Widland Trust Fund.

In October, 1969, under the leadership of President Bill Kassin, Kiwanis made the renevation of the building its "Preject of the Year," and agreed to underwrite an expenditure estimated to be \$1,500.00 for that purpose. This year, under President Brune, the directors have agreed to continue supporting the project and have voted additional funds.

As of last February 25th, 1,763 man hours of work have been spent upon the project. Thirteen different Kiwanians spent 853 man hours there, altogether. Incidentally, Kiwanian Waldo has given at least half of that time.

As of the same date, \$1,747 had been spent by Kiwanis for material. In addition, much material and work has been denated by various local and Santa Resafirms.

Considerable remains to be done, such as a second coat of paint, landscaping, building fences, building lockers, and repairing the fireplace. The building is already used by eight different Scout groups. It is also rented by Bahi for their Sunday School and is used by the California Meter Vehicle Department for its license examiners. The City provides free water and lights in return for this last service.
