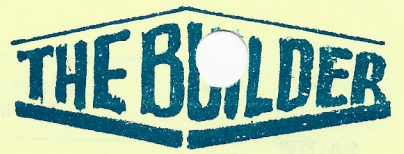

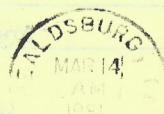

THOUGHTS TO REMEMBER: Kind words do not cost much. Children have more need of models than of critics.

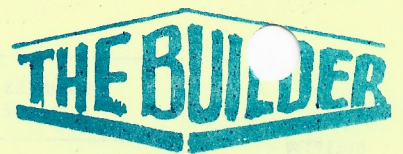

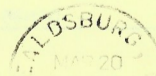
