 His service has been in Healdsburg since 1955. His father purchased their first ambulance from the Chamber of Commerce who used to run the service. Wayne talked about the new procedures in emergency medical care which included a medication that helps restart the heart after a heart attack. He has 2 locations presently, Healdsburg and Windsor. His company is currently the only non tax based ambulance service in Sonoma County.
