AST WEEK'S PROGRAM: Mike Mojica introduced Inga Toroc, Claims Manager for the State's Department of Workmans Compensation located in Santa Rosa. She has been in the industry 20+ years. She knows her business. Inga gave an eye opening talk about the fraud that goes on with Workmans Comp claims. Approximately \$1 billion annually. Workmans Comp is a \$12 billion a year business. It has been around for 79 years. industry has changed trememdously since its inception. It has become very liberal toward the injured worker.

In July 1993 the State Department of Insurance adopted new regulations in an attempt to reform Workmans Comp. Prior to the reforms the State was averaging 540 claims per month.

Due to the reforms that number has increased to 2,000.

The State of California leads the country in Workmans Comp fraud. Most of the fraud takes place in southern California. Most of the fraud in southern California is committed by medical vendors. One doctor alone, Mark Kapplin, ripped of the State for \$30 million and had some of the money wired to a swiss bank account. Til next week.
