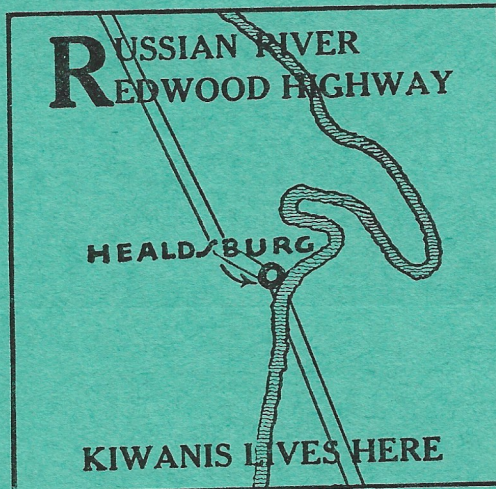

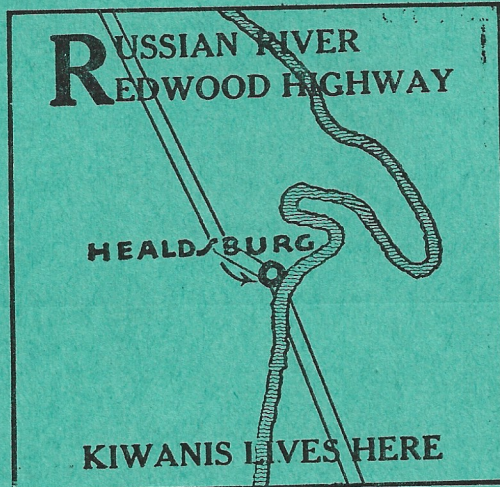
The anniversary dinner of the Santa Rosa Club, last Friday evening was an enjoyable affair. Our club was well represented. There were a few vacant chairs however

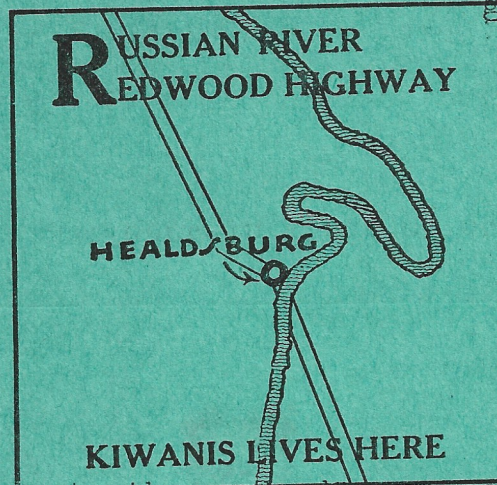

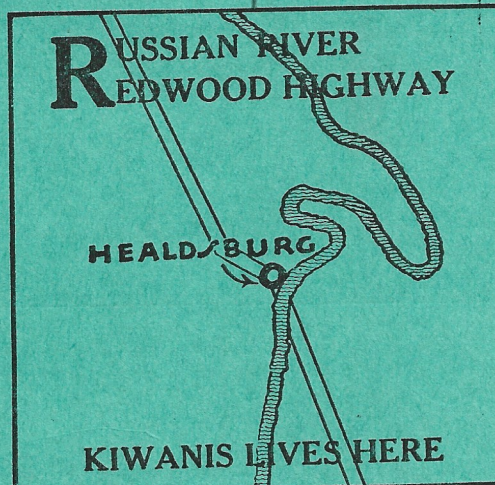
Many thanks to Harold Morehouse for issuing the bulletins while "ye editor" was on vacation. Good work by our good cleric.
