

There are 11 libraries in the County, the largest being Santa Rosa and the smallest Occidental. Healdsburg has the most recent and the most beautiful, and contains one of the top ten Wine Libraries in the world. (Healdsburg Kiwanians should be proud that they originated the seed money to start the collection through their Wine Auction). The library system is not part of the Cities nor the County, but is an independent authority created in 1970, and derives its income from a share of property taxes. Two and a half million people visited the county libraries last year. School libraries are rated the lowest in support of all the

states and D.C. No elementary school in the State has a library. A most informative talk. CWB
