

# Special Election To Approve New Enclosed Articles and By-Laws Scheduled for July 19 By Dan Maraviglia

Enclosed with your newsletter this month is a copy of the proposed revised Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws for the Memorial Scholarship Fund. As many of you know, the members of the Healdsburg Kiwanis Club are also simultaneously members of the Healdsburg Memorial Scholarship Fund, which is a separate legal entity which serves the specific purpose of being a 501 c (3) organization. The benefit of such an organization to the club is that it allows contributions made to the Scholarship Fund to be tax deductible for those who give. As you may recall earlier in the year the board of the Memorial Scholarship Fund set out to investigate ways to improve the rate of return for the Fund which had been averaging about 2 % a year. After much investigation, the Board settled on investing with a specialized mutual fund for non-profit organizations which is run by the American (Please see Page 2)

## Teen Center Project Is A Go; Need Electrical and Fire Sprinkler Experts

The proposed Teen Center which will be erected behind the Healdsburg Boys and Girls property should be up and running by October or November. The club members heard this news from president Dan Maraviglia who advised that the club has agreed to buy the five year old 24 x 60 modular building at a cost of \$37,900. from the Baptist Church of Windsor.
