

There will be no charge for regular members as this will take the place of the noon meeting. However, guests and senior members will be charged \$15. Guests and family members are invited and urged to attend.

The Salvation Army's Lytton Facility and the Kiwanis Club have a long time association dating back to the 1930s when Lytton was a home for boys and girls.



Projects and Scholarship Reports

Pete Peterson, projects and membership treasurer, and Chuck Reichel, treasurer of the Healdsburg Kiwanis Memorial Scholarship fund, both gave semi-annual reports on the status of the funds. The Project Fund Cash Flow Report as of June 30, 2006, reflected the activity from January 1 to June 30, 2006.

Pete advised on the various projects conducted by the club: the recent carnival netted us \$237.39 ;The Future Farmers Country Fair food booth showed an income of \$12,369.22, expenses of \$4, 498.73 giving us a net of \$7,870.49; and the pancake breakfast netted us

\$11,806.31. After expenses of a little over \$6,000, plus a beginning cash balance, the cash in that fund as of that date came to a little over \$33,000.

Chuck Reichel reported that the June 11th Fitch Mountain Foot Race brought in approximately \$5,000 which will be invested in the Healdsburg Memorial Scholarship Fund. Income from this fund helps to provide 4 scholarships to graduating Healdsburg High School seniors.
