



## Explorer Medical Post Approved by the Board; New Program Will Start in August

Funding for a new program for youth, a Medical Explorer Post, was approved by the board of directors at a special meeting held July 17 following the luncheon meeting. The special session was called because of a lack of a quorum at the regular board meeting on July 12. The board approved—a funding of \$2,000.

Kurt Hahn, a long time member of the Kiwanis Club and a member of the board of directors of the Healdsburg Hospital District, had initially proposed the idea of Kiwanis Club co-sponsoring the Explorer Post with the Healdsburg District Hospital on June 14 and appeared at the July 12 meeting to explain the proposed program. Working closely with hospital personnel, the program, hopefully, will influence the students to look at medicine as a profession.

Kurt explained to the board that 30-40 high school students will probably participate in the program, meeting once a week with exposure to the technical departments at the hospital, medical procedures, the Santa Rosa Junior College nursing program and Bell's ambulance. There will be some field trips and a school bus will need to be rented. Hopefully, the program will help to build interest in medical and technical jobs to which the Explorers will be exposed. Kurt will serve as Kiwanis chairman of this program.
