Board of Directors Meeting

Summarized from minutes by Nancy Arsenault

The following is a summary of actions taken and items discussed during the October 2021 Board meeting:

Administration Management

Financials

- Total assets are currently \$19,004 of which \$10,000 is in the Admin Reserve Fund, and \$0.00 in the Charity Fund.
- \$100 was approved for Boosters Club last month.
- The Steelhead Festival is cancelled. The Army Corp of Engineers has not approved the festival due to COVID.

Healdsburg Kiwanis Foundation

Grants/Donations/Requests

- Doug Price, Scout Troop 21, will address the Club as a guest speaker on November 2, 2021, to discuss future scout projects and donations to Scout Troop 21.
- Kids Scoop News magazine - \$600. Nicole Nobi, representing the magazine requested funding for \$300 per classroom to be donated to Healdsburg Elementary School. We have contributed for two classrooms in the past.
- Santa Rosa Symphony League - \$1,000. We have donated for the last 7 years.

Foundation Financial Report/Business:

- Total assets in the fund are \$93,830. This total includes:
 - Restricted Endowment Fund - \$6,863.
 - Unrestricted Endowment Funds include the Jordan Strong Memorial - \$5,070 and the Fall Pledge Drive - \$32,387 for a total Children's Fund of \$44,321.
 - 3-year reserve @ \$15k per year - \$30,000. (\$15k for the current year has been moved to the unrestricted fund.)
 - Unrestricted funds of \$19,509 are available for donations.

- A motion was made to take the Fall Pledge Drive money total of \$32,387, minus \$4,000 to be given to vocational schools, to be moved into the permanently restricted Endowment Fund. However, the motion was withdrawn after discussion and a decision made that a committee be formed to decide what to do with the funds. Liz will chair the committee. Barbara and Randy volunteered to be on the committee along with asking others in the club who might be interested. There is no restriction on how much of the money we specify for vocational schools.

So, we need to pass out dictionaries to both 3rd and 4th graders. Denny will contact Dick B. to find out if the school is interested in this new dictionary delivery system to youngsters.
- Rowdy is both president and on the board. He will resign as a board member. Loretta will be contacted by Denny to ask if she would replace the empty board chair. Randy will check with the by-laws to see how to proceed.

Meetings

September 14:

Nancy Arsenault's guest at our September 14 meeting was Tony a formerly homeless man who she befriended at the Redwood Gospel Mission Nomadic Shelter. Nancy helped Tony get back on his feet by guiding him through the processes of getting a birth certificate, social security, a bank account, and other needs for a normal life.

A few winters ago, Tony was living on the street, sleeping under the 6th Street bridge or wherever else he could find some sort of cover.

Then the weather changed.

"When the rain started coming, I had a hard time trying to find a place to sleep", he says. "The Nomadic Shelter was the only other place I could go that was immediate."

"When I got to Nomadic Shelter, I didn't expect to be blessed the way I was," Tony remembers. "It was just like hitting the gates of heaven. It was very Welcoming."

One of the people Tony met was Nancy, who was volunteering. God had ordained them to be friends. There's just no other way to say it. Unprompted by anyone at the Mission, Nancy decided she wanted to help Tony.

"I needed help getting my social security, I needed help going to doctor's appointments, I needed help doing all kinds of things," says Tony - "Nancy got involved, and so we started hanging out, she started taking me to my doctor's appointments, helped me get new glasses, and an ID. I didn't have an ID before for 30 something years! She got me started."

"I was broken inside, and I was physically broken, but once I hit the Nomadic Shelter, everything changed. It

seemed like everything was healing for me, and that's where I met Nancy," Tony says. "I have a lot of connections now and all that stems from the Nomadic Shelter"

Now Tony and Nancy go to church together, and Tony has become part of Nancy's extended family.

"I thank God because without the Nomadic Shelter, I don't know what I would have done," says Tony. "Now I'm taking care of myself with His help, the church's help and everybody else."

The Nomadic Shelter is a county-wide ministry organized by the Redwood Gospel Mission to help provide shelter to the homeless community in Santa Rosa.

During the colder months of the year RGM's facilities reach max capacity—often having to turn people away. The nomadic shelter partners with churches across the county to help offset the surge for those needing warm shelter and providing additional care, support, and food night-after-night.

Please help update our banners

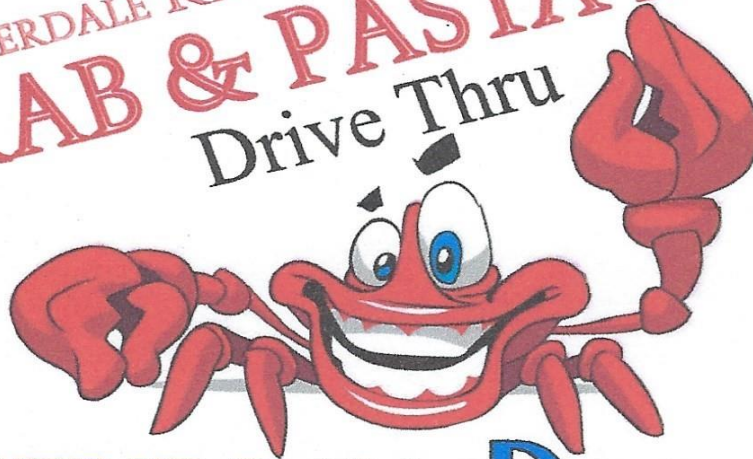
Our club has 8 Kiwanis Honors banners that proudly hang on our meeting room wall during our meetings. Two of them shown below.
