# Fire and Earthquake Safety Expo Our gift to the community Celebrating our 100th Anniversary

Saturday May 6 dawned with intermittent rain but in spite of this inconvenience, The Fire and Earthquake Safety Expo opened on schedule and was a very successful event.

First and foremost, our thanks to the many generous Expo Sponsors who made the event possible. It could not have happened without you!



Event expenses were completely covered by the generous financial support of these folks with a surplus that will help support our other 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary events.

Over 60 exhibitors, including many of the event sponsors, showed up early and were set up and ready by 10 AM. Exhibits were varied, but all very interesting and informative. They included preparedness workshops in English and Spanish, meeting and interacting with first responders, disaster simulations and live fire suppression demonstrations. Visitors also learned about the new city evacuation map and how to best evacuate, and how to protect homes and pets during emergencies.

One of the most popular exhibits was the earthquake simulation trailer provided by PG&E at great expense, that shook up brave people willing to climb aboard, by a simulated 7.2 earthquake. Another attraction was the landing of the Sonoma County Sheriff's Henry 1 rescue helicopter.

Loretta started out with a history lesson on the European region, from the formation to the nation of Czechoslovakia at the end of WWI to the Soviet occupation and life behind the Iron curtain following WWII, to the separation into the presentday separate countries of the Czech Republic and Slovakia following the fall of the Iron Curtain.

Prague is the capital city of the Czech Republic. Remarkably Prague is the only national capital in the war zone that was not bombed during WWII. So, the centuries old colorful baroque buildings, Gothic churches and medieval monuments remain and are well maintained and in good condition.

The city is bisected by the Vltava River. Attractions are the old Charles Bridge over the river and Old Town Square in the heart of the city's historic core.

Our poor old food trailer limped to the fairgrounds for at least one more year after a crew did the best they could to clean it up and be ready for service.

The weather was pleasant on the cool side and sales were brisk with gross sales of \$4,349 on Thursday night and \$6,555 and \$5,309 on Friday and Saturday. Total sales were \$16,213 and estimated expenses were \$5,458, for a net profit of \$10,755. The contents of the tip jar added another \$744.

The event went very smoothly under the direction of hard-working committee chair Denny Stead. Thanks also to all the hard-working club members and Key Clubbers who logged in many hours performing all the necessary tasks, including shopping, setup, cooking, running food between cooks and sales staff, sales, and cleanup. Special thanks to Safeway for a credit of \$100 toward purchase of soda, water and other miscellaneous items.
