

250 Dictionaries Distributed To Third Grade Students As Part of Club's First Book Project

This is the consensus exclaimed by many of the 20 club members participating in the fifth annual First Book Project just completed this past week. 250 beautifully illustrated Scholastic Children's Dictionaries were handed out by Dennis Stead and his Kiwanis Club's First Book Project Committee to all third grade students in the five elementary schools in the district. – Healdsburg Elementary, Foss Creek, St. John's, Alexander Valley and Westside. The project cost approximately \$2250.

The students were told that they could keep the dictionaries at school or at home following a brief message by Dennis on what the Kiwanis Club is and how the club serves the community, especially the youth of the district by sponsoring fund raisers such as the Pancake Breakfast and the food booth at the Future Farmers Country Fair.

Christmas Tree Sale Is A Go; Lot Opens After Thanksgiving

Ken Scharer, chairman of the Christmas Trees Sale, advised the membership that the trees have been ordered and that all permits are on line.

The sales lot will be in the same location as last year, 24 Matheson Street next to the Healdsburg Bar and Grill and across the street from the Healdsburg Hotel.

Ken said that the lot will open for business the day after Thanksgiving, Friday November 26. However, before that there will need to be a number of work sessions to prepare the lot. Ken will be asking the members to sign up for work sessions to help prepare the lot as well as shifts to help sell the trees and miscellaneous items during the weeks the lot will be opened. The 2003 project saw 27 club members volunteer 1,250 hours.

Last year the Kiwanis Tree lot sold out in record time and the project was deemed a financial success as well as a successful community supported event. \$8,000 from the profits of the 2003 Christmas Trees Sale were donated to the Healdsburg Boys and Girls Club to purchase and install a much needed new heating system.
