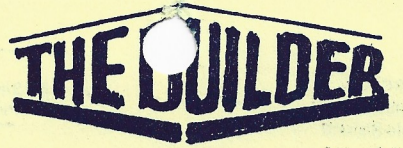

Approximately 90 persons were in attendance and 'a good time was had by all'!

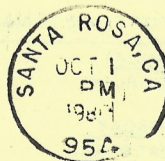
Board Meeting -

Raffle:

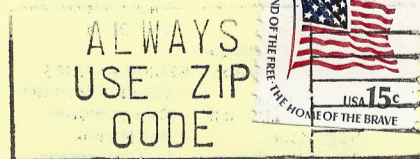
Waldo, Bid Bad Don and Bob Young were the lucky winners!

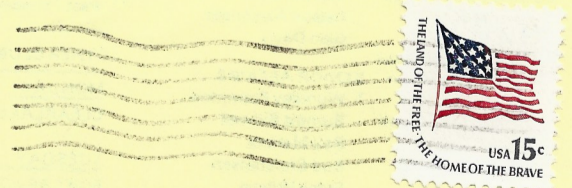
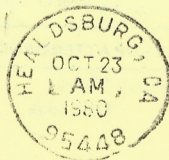
Our President-was fined for loss of the bell and gavel. He purchased the items back for \$5.50 and then fined all present for not filling spaces of tables nearest to Head Table.
