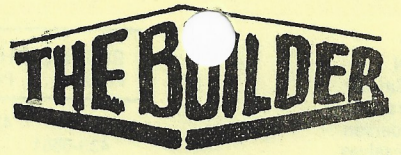

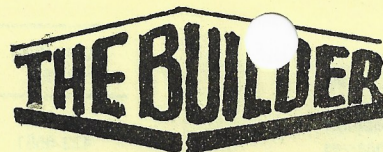

Key Club members Gordon Langford and Steve Henderson paid us a visit. Steve informed us that he likes all sports!

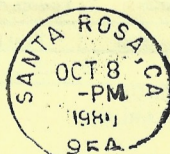
Roger Bowen was given the post of Public Relations Chairman. He's not sure just what will be demanded of him but knowing Roger this reporter feels that it will be worth while.

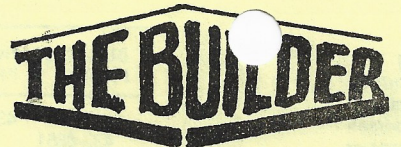
