International Relations

The American Field Service has sent us 2 students who have enrolled in our local high school for the 1969/70 school term. They are Miss Lupita Barral from Guatemala, and Mrs Marco Lasarin from Brazil. A reception is planned for them early in November.

Public and Business Affairs

One meeting with 3 members present. The United Crusade, first in Healdsburg has already met 3/4ths of the quota. This organization has 4 members working at interviews.

The special educational drive to persuade 2/3rds of the voters in Healdsburg was continued in October, and the bond issue of over 1 million dollars was passed on October 14th by a 4/5ths majority.

The reverend Bill Hayes spoke at the Kiwanis Installation Dinner about his 4 years in the ministry in Scotland.
