We congratulate the Jaycees on the all-out program for Christmas cheer.

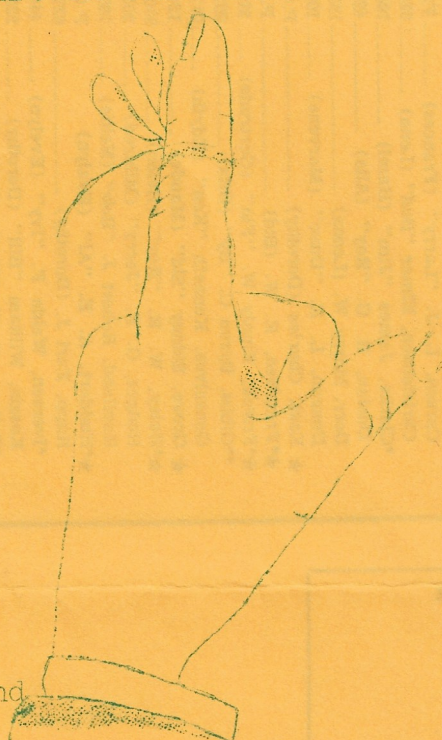
## Along the K Trail:
