Hebert USNR Ret. and violinist who was beach master at the Battle of Iwo Jima. Pat Mottard ETC (ss) was introduced as Navy Recruiter in Santa Rosa. Pat, a submariner, presented a film on that battle which took place 34 years ago. Best guess was 40,000 Japanese troops defending-- a handful survived the battle as prisoners. Iwo Jima was the costliest piece of real estate in history-measured in terms of casualties.

Chief Mottard then brought us up to date in Navy activities today. Points covered were: 1., Need for return of the draft. 2., Starting pay today for a recruit is \$420.00 per month plus room and board. 3., Skill training today is highly sophisticated and effective. 4., Need for doctors and dentists is the greatest in personnel. Also high on the need list are men for nuclear power duty.

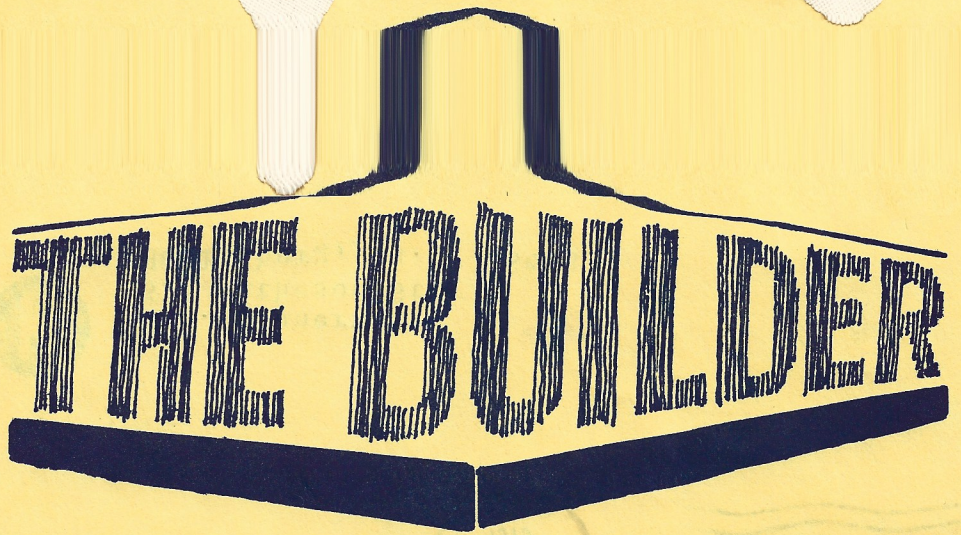
