Our speaker last Tuesday, Colonel "Bill" Lucius, brought us up to date on many of the transportation problems facing the North Bay area. Colonel Lucius, who is a member of the Golden Gate Bridge Board of Directors, pointed out the tremendous growth in highway traffic since 1937 when the bridge was first opened for use. In recent years, the Golden Gate Bridge District has gone into the public transportation business and now operate 188 busses and have contracted for an additional 32 busses. They also have purchased three boats which will be delivered in September 1974.

Bill is convinced the Energy Crisis is very serious and will be with us for many years to come.

Next week, Ed Burke will be program chairman and will present Gary Thompson from the high school who will talk on the "Career Center" recently established at the high school.

The Healdsburg City Council recently named the Kiwanis sponsored play ground on Prentice Drive the "Byron Gibbs Park." Probably no member of this community has given more of his time and energy to youth projects than "By" Gibbs; so it is quite appropriate that a playground for youth should bear his name.

Byron is a past president and past lieutenant governor of Kiwanis and was most active in club activities for many years. During the years he served as principal of the Elementary School. He helped establish a Red Cross Summer Swimming Program which has continued for many years; was active on the F.F.A. Fair Board; helped guide the growth of the Healdsburg Boy's Club, and numerous other activities for young people too numerous to mention.

The Kiwanis Club will again be putting on a dinner for the High School Basketball and Wrestling teams during the third week in March. You will hear more about this activity in the next couple of weeks.

Bruno Rodello will be absent for the next month while he is on a trip to Europe.

The Directors voted to donate \$50. to the high school's "Student Welfare Fund."
