Tuesday Zoom Meetings

Jan 5: - Glaydon de Freitas, CEO of Corazon.

Glaydon came to the United States from his native Brazil to study law at the University of Houston and was a United Nations fellow at the Oxford Consortium for Human Rights. More recently, Glaydon served as the head of strategic planning for the Refugee and Immigrant Center for Education and Legal Services (RAICES) in Houston Texas.



Glaydon believes deeply in the dignity and worth of every human being. These values have always been an integral part of who he is, instilled in him by his father, who gave Glaydon the Universal Declaration of Human Rights at the age of six and pored over every article with him. He is a lawyer with expertise in immigration and international law and a skilled strategic planner. His childhood was split between the megacity of Sao Paulo and a remote region of the Amazon where the nearest grocery store was a five-hour drive away. He is trilingual, speaking Portuguese, Spanish, and English fluently.

Glaydon applied for and received several offers for a new position, but upon visiting Healdsburg, he was impressed with the community spirit, the pleasant living conditions, and the mission of the new position. He had been frustrated by the political and bureaucratic barriers at his former position in Houston, but such barriers are minimal here.

Glaydon discussed a new case management program designed to help underserved residents meet their specific challenges. The program would define barriers for each individual and develop a plan for addressing the person's needs. Barriers are different for individuals and could include language, education, job training, computer skills, and legal services.

Jan 12: – Chris Vanden Heuvel, Supt. of HUSD.

We were happy to welcome our Healdsburg Unified School District Supt., Chris Vanden Heuvel to our lunch zoom meeting on January 12. In his presentation, Chris talked about how the past year evolved and what the new year might look like with the possibility of students returning to the classroom.

HUSD is partnering with Healdsburg Education Foundation (HEF) and Corazon Healdsburg to collaborate with Acosta Education Partnership to:

- Lead professional development for teachers and staff starting in January.
- Lead board workshops for Board of Trustees in February.
- Help the district adopt a culturally responsive and humanizing approach to their curriculum and pedagogy.

The goal is to engage students, build community, promote academic excellence by applying a culturally responsive lens to everything we do.

Distance Learning:

- Distance Learning began for our students after Spring Break in March 2020 when the shelter in place was ordered.
- The 2020-2021 school year began with distance learning on August 19, 2020 and will continue with that instructional method through February 12, 2021.

Distance Learning Concerns:

- Increase in D's and F's
- Not limited to HUSD – Countywide issue.
- Data point: 71% of Sonoma County high school students said the biggest obstacle to distance learning is "worry/anxiety about their future."

HUSD wants to reopen to in-person learning as soon as safe. Concerns and goals are:

- Student Social/Emotional Health – Isolation/pandemic anxiety and depression are prevalent amongst youth.
- More accurate and validity in assessments; more efficient to track and monitor student progress.
- Better instructional/Learning Model.
- Economic Driver – Parents' schedules and their ability to return to work.

- A sense of school community and returning to normalcy.

Our kids need to be in school and deserve more than we can currently offer.

Jan 19: – Nancy Dobbs, Sonoma County Local News Initiative President.

Nancy Dobbs is President of Sonoma County Local News Initiative, the nonprofit working hard to save local journalism including our own Healdsburg Tribune. Nancy, along with her late husband John Kramer, founded KRCB in 1981. KRCB TV 22 went on the air in 1984 as a member station of the Public Broadcasting Service (PBS), a designation the station still holds.

Our journalism provides local citizens the information they need to make the best possible decisions about their lives, their communities, their governments and their shared civic and cultural life. 25% of American newspapers have gone out of business. Others have been purchased by hedge fund investment firms. The Sonoma County Local News Initiative, together with you, will not let this happen to The Healdsburg Tribune, Cloverdale Reveille, Sonoma West Times & News or The Windsor Times. We've seen the consequences of decisions made in the absence of the facts. Local journalism gives us trustworthy, balanced reporting in times of celebration and in times of crisis. Hayley Bly from the Boys and Girls Clubs of Sonoma-Marin joined us to talk about the creative ways the clubs have met the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic and how they are helping the children of Healdsburg and beyond succeed with distance learning.

The Boys and Girls Clubs' Mission:

"We inspire and enable all young people, especially those who need us most, to realize their full potential as productive, responsible and caring citizens."

The mission is achieved by supporting learning and health and wellness by the Clubs providing the following programs.

Supporting Learning

- 34 Academic Programs.
- Aligned to new standards and fully integrated into school day.
- Goal: 100% of Members complete 100% of school and homework daily.

Supporting Health and Wellness

1. 37 Sports and Fitness programs.
2. 26 Live-choice programs
3. Child Nutrition Program: 350,000 meals served per year.

The clubs have met the COVID-19 challenges by changing operations to a distance learning model. These changes have had a significant effect on the number of kids served, staffing and cost.

Distance Learning Clubs

- Open 8-5:30 for learning pods of 12 students at 13 locations
- Extended hours by 183% to serve kids DURING and after school.
- Full support to attend school daily via apps and zoom with individualized tutoring.

Current Reality

- 3,500 club spaces dropped to 396 in Distance Learning model.
- 81% pf Current Club Members are low income or extremely low income and can't afford current program.
- 73% are English Learners and need additional academic support.
