Gibbs Park needs our club's attention

Gibbs Park, located at the north end of Prentice Drive is a 2-acre City park named in honor of Byron Gibbs. Byron Gibbs was our President in 1945, the same year he became School Superintendent. He also was Division Lt. Governor. He was instrumental in the building of Fitch Mt. School, and Gibbs Park as well as Giorgi Park.



Gibbs Park

Gibbs Park was created in 1974 with major donations and support from our Club including purchase of much of the playground equipment. The Park has a rich history that includes our Club. Throughout the late 70's and into the 80's dozens of trees were planted including a grove of about 15 redwood trees in 1985. NorthBay Savings held contests for tree planting and our own Jack Brandt was winner in 1982 for planting a tree for the Tree of the Month Club. In 1989 local Eagle Scout candidate David Mounts built an irrigation system.

In 2004, the Healdsburg community including our club and many of our members helped to completely renew Gibbs Park. The park was transformed with new playground equipment, benches, and a shade structure. It is now 18 years later, and it is time for our club to roll up our sleeves and give the park some Kiwanis TLC.

We will connect with the City Parks Department and work on a timeline for sanding, painting, and other Park improvements. Together we can freshen up the park and help lead us into our 100th Club Anniversary!

The following is a summary of actions taken and items discussed during the January 2022 Board meeting:

- The Board approved the requested \$125, half of the 2022 Chamber of Commerce dues shared with the Foundation Fund.

Other Business:

• Chase Conley's requested resignation was approved. He has moved to Windsor.

- A motion that the \$2,566 proceeds from the Christmas Mulled Wine event be split in half and given to both the Foundation and Admin was approved.

Presentation to Board:

Board member Denny Stead presented plans for the club's 100th Anniversary Celebration.

- Anna suggested at the general meeting that we could use a Sponsorship Packet used by the Cal. Parks & Rec as a model.
- Sponsorship is key to funding this event and we will need to heavily hit this area.
- Another consideration would be to take over the FFA parade and we will need to make a presentation to their board for approval.
- The entire year will be very exciting, and we need to begin now to prep for the 2023 launch year.
- The first meeting will be to address the various subcommittees to make the program successful. For now, Denny is requesting that the club purchase two commercial 10x10 pop-ups with our name on each for an approximate total of \$1,000 to be used for future events. A motion approving this request was passed.


