

It was a great day - our thanks to Rob Pulson and Vance Dokerty.




### SAD NEWS



There are now four centers in the USA with the primary center still in Santa Rosa. It takes two years to train a dog and costs \$10,000. It costs the user \$125 and they must go through a training and bonding program with the dog. If no bonding takes place then the user must start over with another dog.

### DID YOU KNOW

That in 1929 the first Healdsburg Wine Fest was held on May 19th. Kiwanis made \$302 at their Bar-B-Que booth. That in 1959 Division 8 was split into two divisions and the Healdsburg Kiwanis Club was put in Division 32.
