
Pancake Breakfast Is A Winner! But the Club Can Do Better Says This Year's Chairman

An official report of the 52nd annual Pancake Breakfast was given to the club members at the March 25 meeting by chairman Rick Norman . He announced that the projected income to the project fund is a net of \$13, 185. Rick reported there was a gross income of \$16,515 and an expense of \$3,330, leaving a very good net. The double truck plus half a page advertisement in The Tribune brought in \$7,510, tickets sold or bought by members came to \$4,824, tickets to the general public amounted to \$1,772 and pledges from club members to offset miscellaenous costs came to \$2,175. In addition sales of potted plants which decorated the tables and contributions brought another \$234.

Rick said that "I believe we can do a better job on non-member sales of tickets to the community, thereby increasing our guest count to 800 with a

projected income level of \$15,000."

In addition he expressed his appreciation to the club members for their hard work and added that "I want to especially thank the many pledge donors whose financial contributions helped us to make this one of the most financially successful pancake breakfasts."
