June 11 Fitch Mountain Foot Race Funds Will Be Added To Scholarship


As has been the procedure during the past years the income from the annual Fitch Mountain Foot Race will be invested in the Healdsburg Kiwanis Club's Memorial Scholarship Fund.

The Foot Race, set for Sunday, June 11 with a starting time of 8 a.m. in the Plaza Square, in the past has generated about \$5000 to \$6,000. The income from the fund is used to give 4 scholarships to graduating Healdsburg High School seniors.

Lee Gunnerson, chairman of the race, advised members that the assignments for the race have been made (see copy in this issue of The Builder). If you are not available on June 11' please contact Lee or Joe Engler. All those who have received an assignment should be at their post fifteen minutes before the race starts.

If you wish to participate in the race, 10 K or 3 K, contact Jerry Strong. Registration fees prior to June 6 are \$20 for adults, \$15 for children and seniors. Race day registration fees are \$25 adults, \$20 children and seniors.

All registered runners will receive a commemorative T-shirt. And first place winners in each category will be presented with a special hand cast medallion.

Kiwanis Will Take On Sponsorship of Street Dance From Boys & Girls Club


