- NEXT WEEK:** Phil Rice entertains us with Brian Wadkins, Resident agent for the F.B.I. Book 'em, DANO.



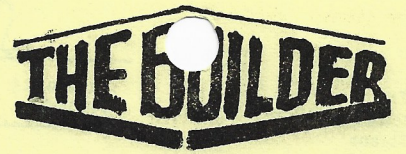

Mario Deas & Tom Passalacqua

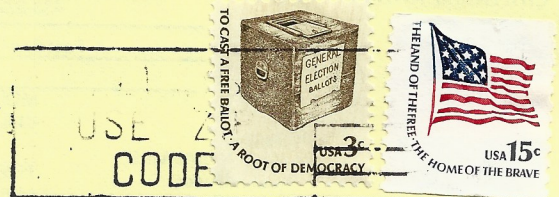
FINES:

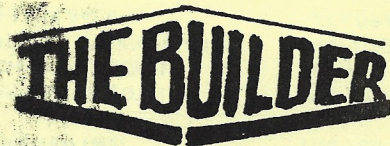

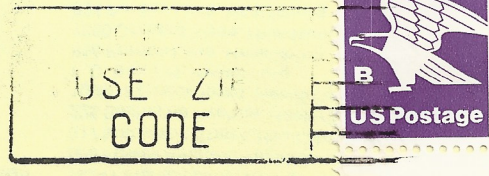
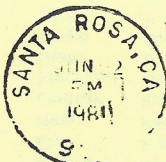
