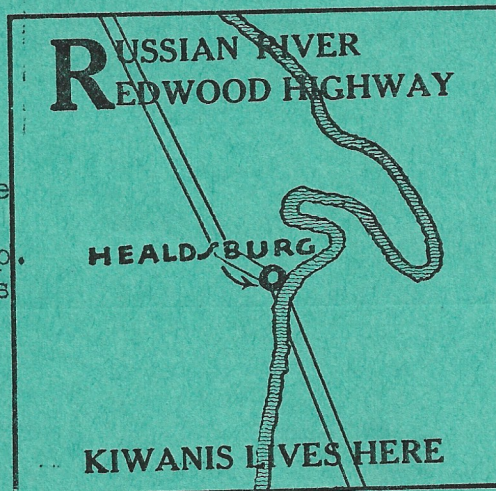

was warm.



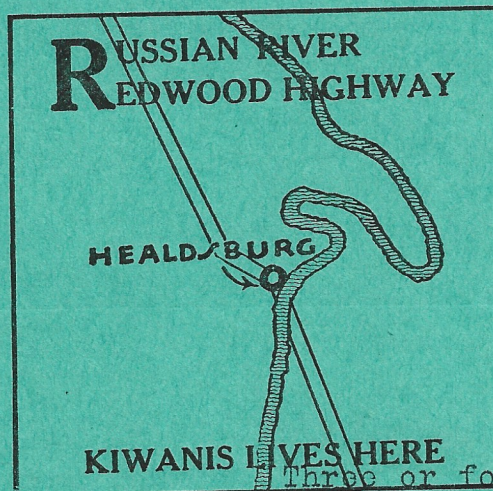

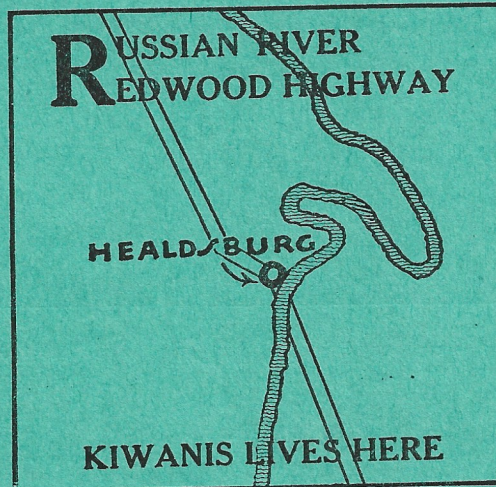

Without unduly boosting the stock of New York Life, Mr. Dick Stewart gave us a smooth business-like talk last week on how the big companies are cooperating in war activities.

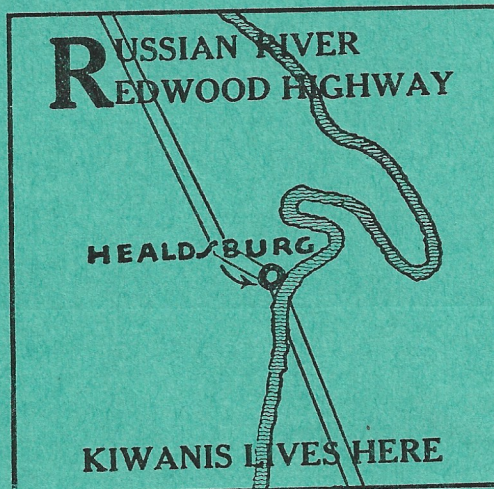
In Charlie's absence, ^{finally} had a chance to "rehearse" for next year.
