They're off!

About 150 runners registered for the 10k and 3k courses of the 46th annual Fitch Mountain Footrace held on Sunday June 19. The event went off very well thanks to the efforts of event co-chairs Ron and Debi Doble, event committee members, the many club members and other volunteers needed to monitor each intersection along the racecourse and Boy Scout Troop 21 members who manned the water stations, all of whom deserve a huge thank you for a job well done. Special thanks to our 28 sponsors shown on back page, participating at the \$250 or \$500 level. Healdsburg Running Co. provided timing services.

The fastest 10K runner was Dante Godinez who finished in 35:20:19. Winner of the 3K was Simon Kolber at 11:23:99.

Total revenue banked was about \$9,500 (\$8,000 from 28 sponsorships and about \$1,500 in registrations). Expenses were about \$4,500, leaving net proceeds of about \$5,000 for the benefit of the Healdsburg Kiwanis Memorial Scholarship fund.

In a very informative discussion Gina gave an update on the Center for the Arts and their programs for our local youth.



Healdsburg Center for the Arts (HCA) is a multidisciplinary (501-c3) non-profit recognized as a cultural anchor in Healdsburg and surrounding communities. HCA provides audiences of all ages, orientations, and ethnicities a place to imagine, connect, learn, explore, and provide access to experiences that inspire and transform!

Programs include a gift area of artisan made work; an education program including mentoring for artists, ongoing art instruction, after school programs and a six-week Summer Art Camp; and expanding the exhibitions. One of the most popular exhibitions is the Young Artist Show featuring works from area elementary schools and the HCA youth education program.
