TODAY is the day for the annual inter-club at Fort Bragg. The group leaves at 9:00 A.M. and will be home in the late afternoon. Members going should contact Walt Wright. How about some new faces?

Terry Stringfellow is program chairman for today. He's trying to get a politician with a non-political message!!

LAST WEEK, Walt St. Clair of Alexander Valley was Waldo's guest. Bob Hanusa of Wailuku, Maui was a visiting Kiwanian.

Another Inter club, this time at Ukiah was a success, with seven in attendance. Unfortunately, all but Fran Branern had been to at least one Inter club before.

Wood Frampton read a letter of thanks from the Smith River Kiwanis Club for our \$25.00 contribution to that club's massive, million and a half dollar project, the Rowdy Creek Fish Hatchery...They think big.

Our program was provided by Dr. Stanley Davis, recently established here as our area's first psychiatrist. He was attracted here by living conditions and by sophisticated medical facility at the Healdsburg Hospital. An area population of 10,000 (which we exceed) needs a psychiatrist. He stated that 43% of the men and 73% of the women will sometime in their lifetime develop a psychological problem, such as depression. Dr Davis spends most of his time with ordinary people dealing with problems faced by most people at various times in their lives. Such things as marriage or courtship, caring for teenage children, family illness or death, and retirement often generate such problems that we need help to cope with them.

As a beginning of the Board's program to improve club attendance, President Fred read the Club By-Laws on attendance, the key paragraph of which reads "Any active member absent without excuse from four successive meetings, or any senior member who, without excuse, shall fail to attend at least 12 meetings in any calendar year, shall upon vote of 2/3 of the entire Board of Directors stand suspended". There follow regulations with respect to notification, actual suspension, re-instatement, dropping, termination of senior membership, and credit for attendance credit in lieu of being at a regular meeting.

Remember, a member who does not come to meetings gains little from the club, and gives little to it-----
