## LAST WEEKS PROGRAM

Mark Ihde-Sonoma County Sherriff. The new jail facility opened Oct. 1991. There are 404 beds in this facility. The county will need to add to the new building due to overcrowding. That will be done at a cost of \$16 million. Currently the capacity is a total of 900 inmates. This year the average monthly bookings are up 8%. Felony bookings are up 26%. 54% of the people booked by the Sherriffs dept. primary charge is drug or alcohol related.

The Sherriffs department has a budget of \$40 million dollars. This budget could potentially be cut by \$8 million dollars.





"NOBODY WANTS TO JOIN KIWANIS" (excerpt from Pathways To Service)

Every Kiwanian has heard these famous words when membership growth was mentioned, "I don't know anybody who is interested in joining Kiwanis." With that attitude, nobody will join!
