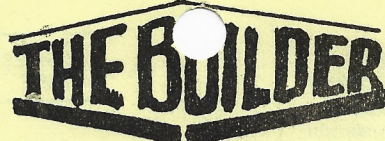

Woody Frampton, George Coppinger and Bill Ferguson all donated \$5.00 for the privilege of listening to our beautiful rendition of Happy Birthday.

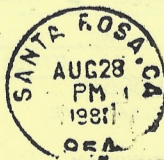
Vern Branch announced an interclub on Wednesday, August 26 at the Black Forest Inn.

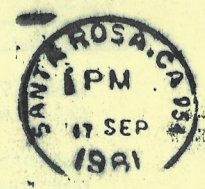
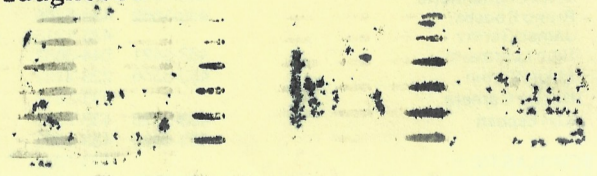
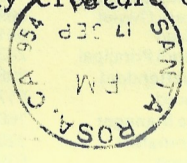
DIVISION GOLF TOURNAMENT:

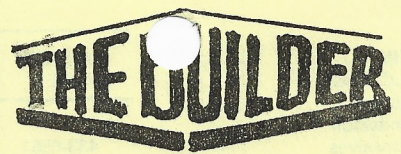

LAST WEEKS MEETING:

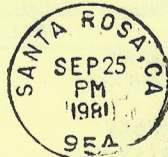
Program chairman and speaker were one and the same in the person of Kurt Hahn who gave us an enlightening picture of the City of Healdsburg's budget and Development Financing programs.
