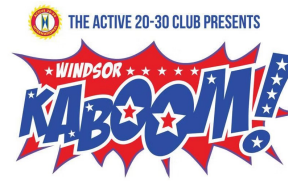

FFA Ag Boosters

“Learning to Do, Doing to Learn, Earning to Live, Living to Serve”

Healdsburg FFA Ag Boosters was established in 2005. We support the Healdsburg High School Ag Department by providing funds to help send FFA members to the State & National Conventions, and Leadership Conferences. We also award annual college scholarships.

Entrepreneurship

Own and operate an agricultural business (e. g. market animal, a lawn care service, a pay-to-fish operation, holiday poinsettia production and sales.)

Placement

Get a job or internship on a farm or ranch, at an agriculture-based business, or in a school or factory laboratory.

Research and Experimentation

Plan and conduct a scientific experiment. (e. g. Determine whether the phases of the moon affect plant growth, or test and determine the efficacy of different welding methods.)

Dry Creek Neighbors

“Kind Words, Kind Thoughts, Kind Deeds”

In November of 1909, the Dry Creek Neighbors Club was organized. It was first known as the Dry Creek Woman’s Home Mission Society. In 1914, the group reorganized as a ladies’ aid society and changed the name to Dry Creek Neighbors Club. We are a group of ladies living in Dry Creek Valley, who work together throughout the year to raise money through various projects.

We use the money raised to fund three annual scholarships for graduating local high school students in both Healdsburg and Geyserville. Since 1955, when the group first decided to award a scholarship of \$50 to a local high school senior, the Dry Creek Neighbors Club has awarded over \$32,250 in scholarship funds to local graduating high school seniors. Not bad for a small neighborhood club of 25 to 30 women!

The rest of the money we raise goes directly back to the community through gifts to local groups and charities, such as North County Community Services, Hospice, the Healdsburg Food Pantry, Healdsburg Education Foundation, Sonoma County Council on Aging, etc.

Foundation, we have helped more than 125,000* women pursue their educational goals by providing more than \$432 million* in educational assistance (scholarships, loans, and grants), making a difference in women’s lives.
